Message from the Director


In Psalm 119, we read, "How can a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed to your word." (Psalm 119:9)




Moving On We've Moved!!!

FirstOne-Year Graduate

little over a year ago my daughter Cara searched the streets of Salinas until she found me and brought me to The Bridge. I had been living on the streets for several years, addicted to crack co caine, homeless, and penniless, with several lengthy stints in the county jail. I had known a time in my life when I had a close walk with the Lord, and had been part of a Christian ministry called Shiloh, centered in Oregon, and was involved in the beginnings of Calvary Chapel Monterey Bay. I gradually strayed away from the Lord, beginning to smoke pot all day, every day, and later added tequila to the equation, which eventually cost me my marriage of 25 years.

When I ended up homeless as a result of my addiction, I would often pray for God's mercy and for Him to deliver me out of my bondage to drugs, to which I was truly a slave. When I arrived at The Bridge, I came in with only the clothes on my back. My feet had been burned in a fluke accident, and I could hardly walk. I had lost my driver's license several years previous, and had not worked at a steady job since then.

I wanted to get sober, but I realized that if the program I entered wasn't a Christ-based home that it wasn't going to work for me. In addition to being Biblically based, The Bridge has the atmosphere of a family home, where you become part of an extended family. We work together, eat together, study the Bible and worship God together. We also attending church together at Calvary Chapel Monterey Bay where the men here are able to make good new positive friendships, receive sound Bible teaching, and have the opportunity to serve in various capacities at the church.

The challenges are great in helping men get back on their feet, as most are broke and have lost their driver's licenses. Many are still working out situations that require court appearances, where Mike drives to Salinas and is present to talk to the judge on behalf of the men.

I have been able to restore my relationship with my children, and am now working again full-time as a carpenter. I am also enjoying being part of the worship team that plays music Monday nights at The Most Excellent Way meetings at Calvary Chapel, and am looking forward to what God has next for me in life.






Helping our Neighbors
