Message from the President



We thank all of those who have helped support the efforts of the Ministry this past year through your prayers and financial contributions.




Run, Forrest, Run!

There were offers of College scholarships, and for a time I had set my mind on running in the Olympics. I was literally running for my life.

My Dad's motto was "If you can't eat it, smoke it or drink it, it is not worth doing." He was okay with settling for less, and this mind-set and way of life was common and familiar to me. Familiar is comfortable, and comfortable can be dangerous.

Well, in the years to come I followed in the footsteps of my father. However, when I met the Lord in 1999 my life began to change. It no longer became okay to settle for less. I began to want my life back. I wanted to do


Serving the City of Pacific Grove
