Also, five house graduates moved into the "Second Phase" of the program and live apart in the Larsen House. These second phase men are recent graduates that are now more independent and working on their own, but are still under the umbrella of Bridge accountability.

The third annual B2B ride and the seventh annual banquet were both huge successes. Your continued volunteer support and contributions made this possible. The Second Chance Thrift Store has blossomed under Michele's supervision and store re-organization. The Bridge men are gaining valuable experience there by learning occupational and management skills; and they are a testimony to all shoppers of the life changing power of the Bridge's ministry. In December, the Bridge Ministry became responsible for the operation of Calvary's Grille. Mike plans to use it as a culinary school so that the Bridge men can learn food preparation and services, valuable training for the Monterey area with it's extensive food and hospitality industry. At the same time, the Grille will continue providing meals for Calvary at standard church functions as well as special church related events. #### Second Chance Thrift Store



There are so many things to say about the store. As many od you know, The Bridge experience includes a working program which provides training on a variety of levels such as job skills, conflict

resolution, holding down a consistent daily schedule, showing up to work sober, and following daily rules. The store is only one aspect of the work portion of the program, there is also training in landscaping, maintenance, janitorial and food service. Some of the residents cross over into multiple work areas. Here at Second Chance, the guys are definitely working hands-on with the public whether with customers in the store, or out on pick-ups at someone's house. Sometimes there are interactions that, I believe, are divinely orchestrated by the Lord, like when a customer needs just a bit of encouragement or hope and somehow there is an opportunity for someone to share about something God is doing in their life. It's a real treat to see when that happens. As I think back over the year, I can recall several times a customer has come in to the shop and has been blessed by a totally unexpected conversation with one of the guys. I love when that happens! We are also so extremely blessed by our volunteers. We have several people who volunteer here in various capacities. We are so grateful for them. Many hands make the work much lighter. Our volunteers are also a wealth of information and I am so grateful for all the input they give. It continues to amaze me how many different types of donations we get. We look things up in the computer and pick the brains of volunteers constantly. Some of our most popular questions are: What is it? What do you do with it? How much is it worth? What is it currently selling for? How much should we sell it for? Those can be some pretty hefty questions and real conversation starters, especially for some of our real unusual pieces. My name is Nick Phillips. This is my second enrollment and year in the Bridge program. The first year, I found a family, served the church and learned quite a lot about myself, although I didn't take my walk and sobriety very seriously. I gained a lot back in my life including being a worship musician for Most Excellent Way, an employee at Calvary Monterey, as a sound technician and musician, and the Second Chance Thrift Store clothing manager.

But, on the 10th month, I ended up relapsing and falling back into jail. I spent Christmas and New Year's Day in jail. I quickly understood how serious the situation was when my probation officer was completely convinced that I should go to prison for 6 years. I couldn't believe that I could ever get myself into this sort of mess. When I gained clarity inside the jail, I remember being mortified at what I had caused myself to lose. I remember praying to God and asking for help. My father was ill and it seemed certain that he would die while i was incarcerated. My son would not be able to have a relationship with his father until he was 16, and I would lose my new found family as well as the person I am in love with. During the most crucial point of my incarceration, Mike and Michelle went to bat for me. Mike pestered my probation officer countless times to find out what could be done, he showed up every week to visit me and at all of my court dates, helped me obtain legal counsel, and organized support

from many people from the church who wrote letters of support to the judge. My probation officer had a feeling that I had enough support to give me another try at the program. I remember being so happy and grateful, I broke into tears. When I came back to the program I decided to really take the program seriously.

My father, Roger Phillips, died in August 2013. I was devastated, but also relieved that my prayers were answered and I was able to be counseled by a pastor and not deal with the grief by myself in jail. God also provided a family, and I feel I've become closer to Mike and Michelle during a pivotal time in my life. I've learned about myself and am grateful for gaining back the really beautiful things of life. I reunite, in a healthier way, with my girlfriend Amanda who has been ultra supportive and faithful. I was able to attend my son's birthday for the first time in 3 years. I work at the Second Chance Store again, and love playing the piano there on Saturdays. I have regained my position as a volunteer sound technician, and in doing so I have been blessed to be a part of a huge growing movement in the worship ministry for The Most Excellent Way. I've learned what it really means to serve God and not expect anything back. I learned that it would not be a bad thing to never leave this family.

In the future, I desire to go through the Second Phase part of the bridge, to work at the Second Chance store, to keep my commitments to the Bridge Ministry and Calvary, and to rebuild my career as a musician and music teacher. Even greater things are yet to come.

I thank God every day that he had his hand on me. I am no longer imprisoned by my habits and self-will.
